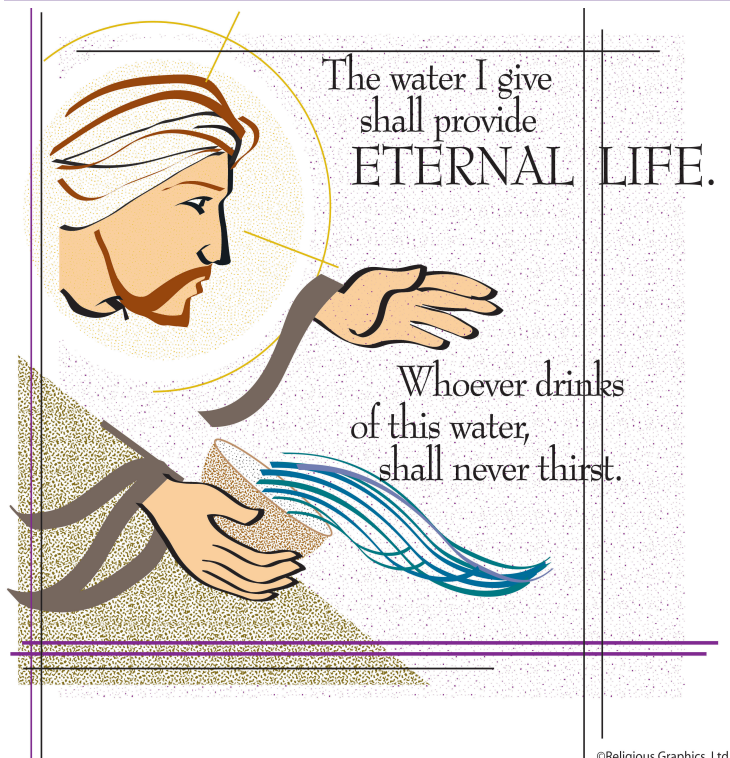

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last week, we were privileged to have Fr. Stephen Pietrowski lead our Lenten Mission. As the framework for his reflections, Fr. Stev used the Gospels we hear during our Lenten journey, this weekend and the next two. During the “A Cycle,” the Mass scriptures for the Sundays of Lent show three powerful scenes from St. John’s Gospel. This weekend, we hear about the Samaritan woman at Jacob’s well who encounters Jesus and has a monumental change of heart. Next weekend, we’ll hear about the man born blind, and then the following Sunday will be the dramatic scene of the raising of Lazarus from the dead. Each of these episodes contains so much for us to consider. Fr. Steve did an excellent job of offering us insights as to how we can see ourselves in each of these passages and how we can use them to deepen our Lenten journey. You can find the first of his reflections this weekend on our website and social media platforms. The remaining two will be posted on the next two Saturdays respectively. I encourage those who were unable to attend to watch each of these recordings, to help especially in preparing for Mass for the remaining time of Lent.

If you haven’t done so already, I strongly urge you to join in a wonderful Lenten practice—the Stations of the Cross. I’ve been encouraged by the increase in attendance over the past two Friday evenings. This prayer, started by St. Francis of Assisi, offers reflections on the final hours of Christ’s life and how He was teaching us even in this most excruciating situation. Stations will be prayed each Friday of Lent at 7pm in the church. It takes only about 30 minutes and can have an immense impact on how you journey the rest of the Lenten season.

May you continue to have a meaningful Lent!

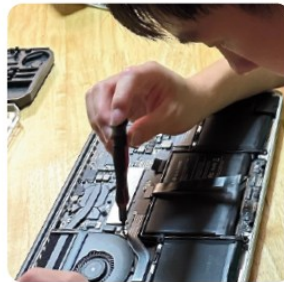

Third Sunday of Lent

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

March 15, 2026 Fourth Sunday of Lent

John 9:1-41

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him. We have to do the works of the one who sent me while it is day. Night is coming when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" —which means Sent—. So he went and washed, and came back able to see. His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is," but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am." So they said to him, "How were your eyes opened?" He replied, "The man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and told me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' So I went there and washed and was able to see." And they said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I don't know." They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet." Now the Jews did not believe that he had been blind and gained his sight until they summoned the parents of the one who had gained his sight. They asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How does he now see?" His parents answered and said, "We know that this is our son and that he was born blind. We do not know how he sees now, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him, he is of age; he can speak for himself." His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that if anyone acknowledged him as the Christ, he would be expelled from the synagogue. For this reason his parents said, "He is of age; question him." So a second time they called the man who had been blind said to him, "Give God the praise! We know that this man is a sinner." He replied, "If he is a sinner, I do not know. One thing I do know is that I was blind and now I see." So they said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He answered them, "I told you already and you did not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?" They ridiculed him and said, "You are that man's disciple; we are disciples of Moses! We know that God spoke to Moses, but we do not know where this one is from." The man answered and said to them, "This is what is so amazing, that you do not know where he is from, yet he opened my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if one is devout and does his will, he listens to him. It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind. If this man were not from God, he would not be able to do anything."

They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out. When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, the one speaking with you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him. Then Jesus said, "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind." Some of the Pharisees who were with him heard this said to him, "Surely we are not also blind, are we?" Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying, 'We see,' so your sin remains.

Reflection Questions

- The healed man's neighbors were confused and questioned whether he was the same person. Why do you think people sometimes doubt when God does something amazing?
- The Pharisees were upset because Jesus healed on the Sabbath. Why do you think they cared more about rules than the miracle Jesus performed? How can we avoid making the same mistake?
- The religious leaders tried to pressure the healed man into saying Jesus was a sinner. How did he respond, and what does this teach us about standing firm in our faith?
- Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, so that the blind will see and those who see will become blind." What do you think He meant by this? How can people be spiritually blind even if they can see physically?
- After reading John 9, what do you learn about God's character? How does this chapter help you understand who He is and how He works in the world?

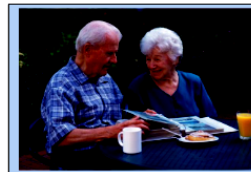

Charitable Donations



The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

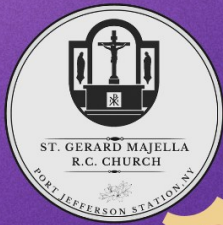

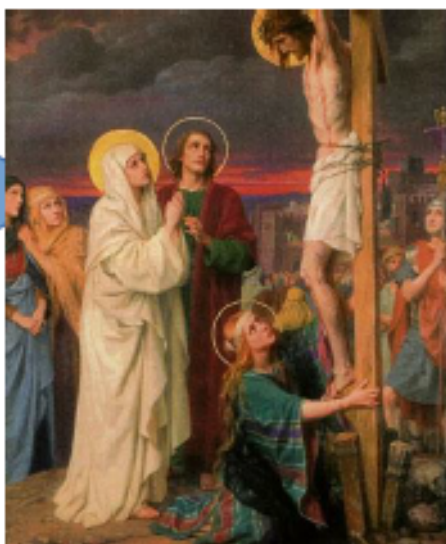

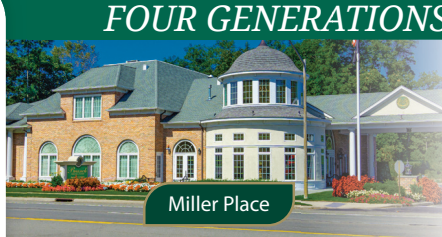
