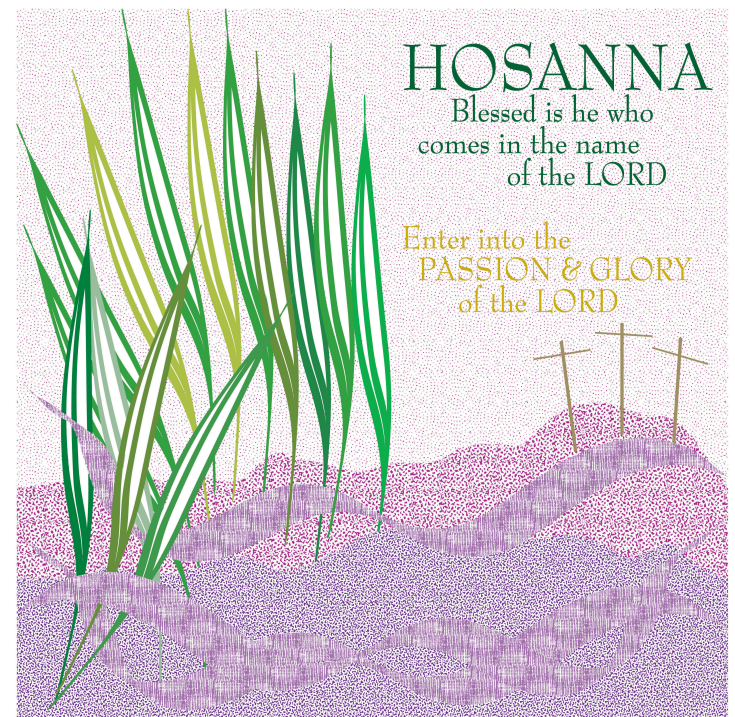

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We commence today the most sacred days of our Christian faith. We hear the crowds herald Jesus as the Son of David, singing, "Hosana, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Only days later, those same shouts will become ones of, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" We then journey those final hours of the Lord's life – the Last Supper, the betrayal, arrest, denial, the farce of a trial, and the brutality of the cross. Because we become so familiar with the events of Holy Week, the power and awe of these holy days can lose its luster. I encourage us all to pray for the grace to enter into this week with fresh eyes, fresh ears, and above all, a fresh heart. Hearing the account of the Last Supper, the Passion narrative of St. John and the account of the Resurrection should move us in new and deeper ways to contemplate the unfathomable love of God for each of us.

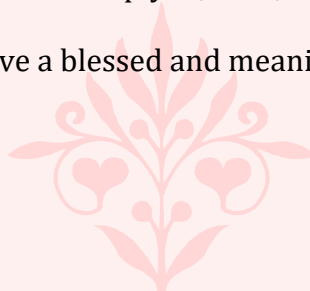
Please consult our bulletin, website, and social media platforms for the complete schedule of Masses and other liturgies. And unless you're reading this bulletin Sunday evening, please consider joining us **Sunday at 4:00pm for Tenebrae at St. Gerard's**. This service is unique to Holy Week and includes scripture, song, and prayer which help us to focus on the wonder of Holy Week. The choirs from both our parishes will be combined for this event. Also, **Stations of the Cross on Good Friday at 12:00pm will be especially for families and children**. We will reflect on the final hours of Jesus' life in a way for our younger kids and teens to see how we can learn from Jesus' example when we deal with our own daily struggles.

On a related note, I would like to share some exciting news. You may have seen in last week's bulletin the advertisement for **our new High School Youth Group**. With leadership from members of both parishes, we aim to have kids from our region find their place within our wider parish family. After receiving Confirmation and concluding their formal religious instruction, this group will be the next step to help our young people become more intentional disciples of Jesus and active members of our Church. So, I need your help! All of you know high schoolers. They're your children and grandchildren, nephews and nieces, neighbors and friends. Please spread the word to them about our first gathering on April 19th at St. Gerard's.

At the beginning of Palm Sunday Mass, we hear the priest say these words – "Dear brothers and sisters, like the crowds that acclaimed Jesus in Jerusalem, let us go forth in peace!" Indeed, let us go forth into these holiest days with open minds and hearts to allow God's transforming grace to move deeply in, with, and through us.

May you and your family have a blessed and meaningful Holy Week

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy. Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

April 5, 2026

The Resurrection of the Lord

John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

Reflection Questions

- What struck you in this text that describes the first experience of the Resurrection?
- The beloved disciple went in, saw and believed. What did he see and what led him to believe? Why is it that the text tells us only the reaction of the beloved disciple and not that of Peter?
- To see and believe. The beloved disciple saw and believed. What is it that leads me to believe that Jesus is alive, that He is present in our midst, today, giving new life to the poor?
- Have you gone through an experience of loss or death? What gave you new life or new hope and the joy of life? What is it that I say when I affirm, "I believe in the resurrection"?
- Mary showed great care and concern for Jesus even after His death. How have you felt this level of care by someone else? How should we care for those we love following this example?

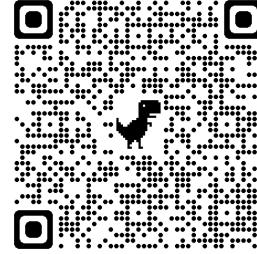

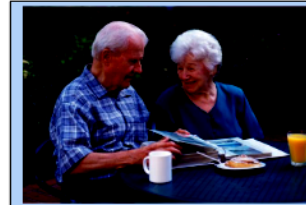

Charitable Donations



The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

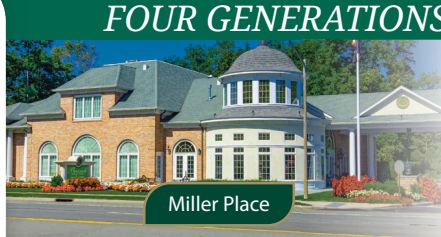
