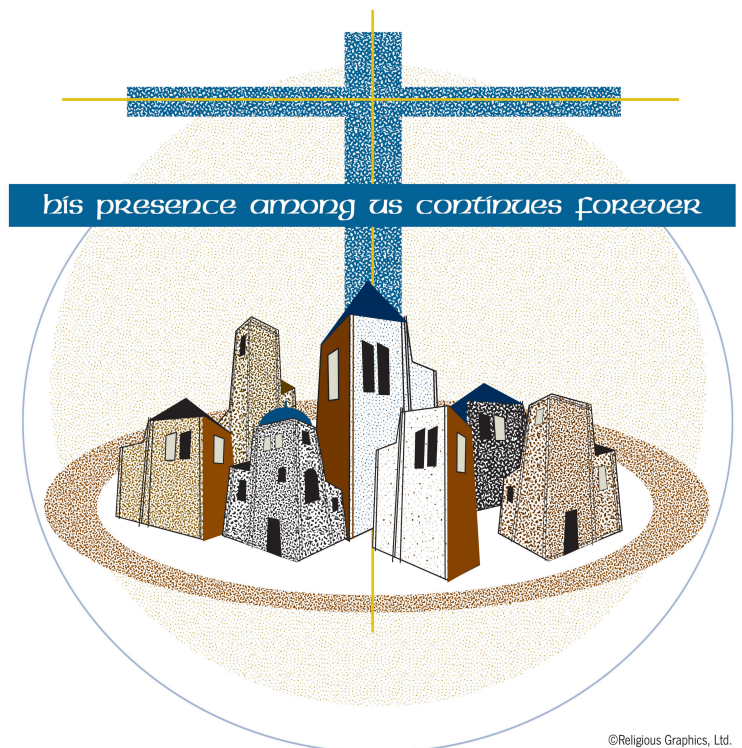

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ!

As we journey through these final days of the Easter Season, the Church invites us to lift our hearts in hopeful expectation of the great Feast of Pentecost. We remember how, on that holy day, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles with power and fire, transforming fearful disciples into courageous witnesses of the Gospel. Pentecost is not merely a remembrance of that past event; it is an invitation for each of us to be renewed today by the same Spirit.

In our busy and often distracted world, it is easy for us to neglect the quiet work that the Holy Spirit is doing within us. Yet, the Spirit continues to guide, strengthen, and sanctify the Church, giving wisdom to the confused, comfort to the sorrowful, courage to the weak, and holiness to all who seek God with sincere hearts. As Pentecost approaches, I encourage every member of our parish family to prepare prayerfully for this sacred celebration.

Take time each day for silence and prayer. Read the Acts of the Apostles, in particular the account of Pentecost in the second chapter. Attend Mass faithfully and, if possible, spend time before the Blessed Sacrament. I especially encourage you to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, allowing the Holy Spirit to cleanse and renew your soul. Families might also gather to pray together, asking for a fresh outpouring of grace upon your homes.

One beautiful tradition of the Church is to pray, during the days leading up to Pentecost, a Novena to the Holy Spirit. I invite you to pray often this traditional prayer:

“Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful
and kindle in them the fire of Your love.
Send forth Your Spirit, and they shall be created,
and You shall renew the face of the earth.
O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit
did instruct the hearts of the faithful,
grant that by the same Holy Spirit
we may be truly wise and ever rejoice in His consolations.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.”

May this Pentecost bring new zeal to our parish, deeper charity within our families, and renewed faith in every heart. Let us open ourselves fully to the gifts of the Holy Spirit, trusting that God still desires to do great things through His people.

Be assured of my prayers for you and your loved ones this week.

Seventh Sunday of Easter

**Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy.
Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?**

May 24, 2026

Pentecost Sunday

John 20:19-23

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Reflection Questions

- Why were the disciples afraid? Who were they afraid of? If you were in the disciples' shoes, would you have been scared, too?
- So, was Jesus simply saying "hello" when He said "Peace be with you" to His disciples? Peace in what? What is the source of your peace?
- Why did Jesus ask about food and then eat the fish and honeycomb?
- Why does Jesus breathe on them and tell them to "Receive the Holy Spirit" now?
- Why does Jesus say to His disciples, "Whose soever sins you forgive, they were forgiven them; whose soever sins you retain, they were retained" (John 20:23)?
- The disciples eventually left the locked room and began sharing the message of Jesus with others. What changed? What ignited their mission?

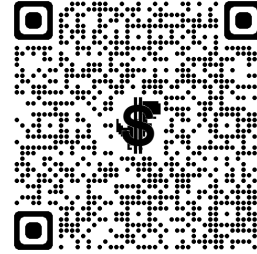

The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What’s called a rollover is actually a “qualified charitable distribution” that can be made to our Parish.

If...

- 1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
- 3. You don’t exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a “qualified charitable distribution”. In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you’ll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

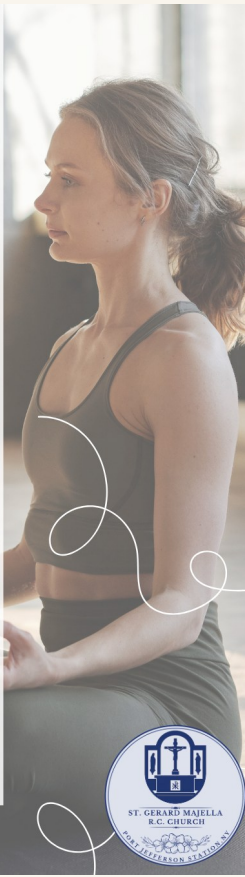
PIETRA FITNESS

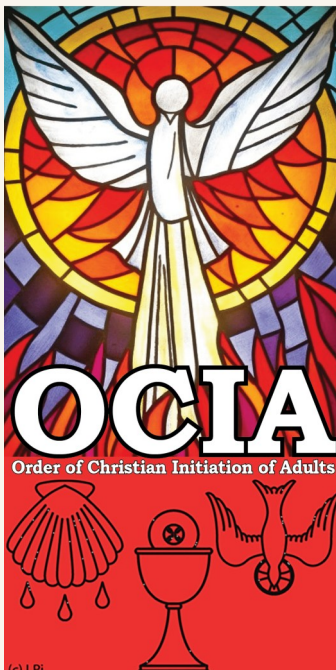

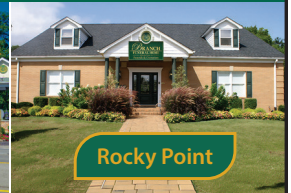

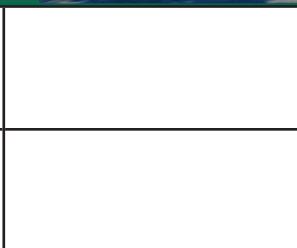
