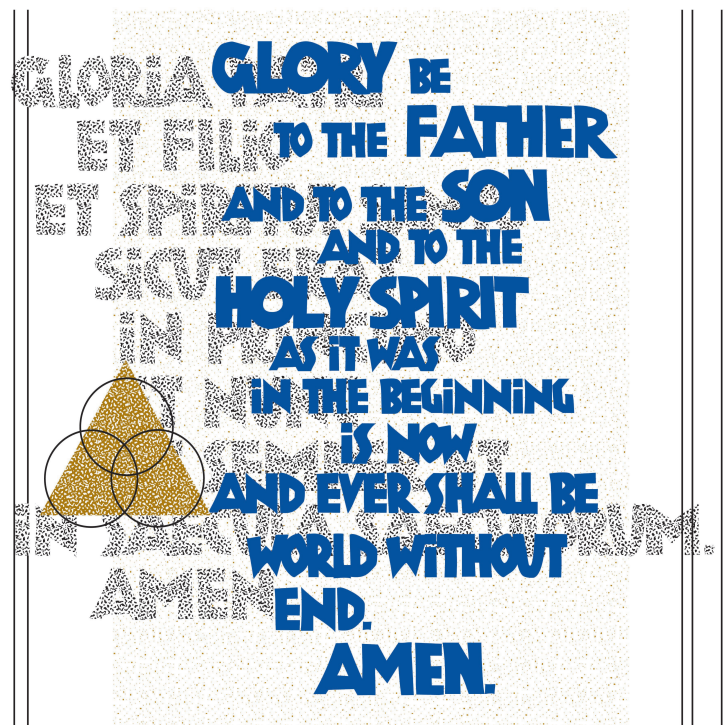

A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday the Church invites us to gaze, with humble wonder, into the heart of our faith. The Most Holy Trinity! One God in three Persons —Father, Son, and Holy Spirit —is not a puzzle to be solved but a mystery to be embraced, cherished, and lived. Each time we make the Sign of the Cross, we trace this mystery upon ourselves, renewing within our minds and hearts that we were created by the Father, redeemed by the Son, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

The Trinity manifests God's very Being — a Communion of Love! What that reveals to us is that love is not an accessory to life; it is the very foundation of reality. The Father pours Himself out in Love; the Son receives and returns that Love perfectly; the Holy Spirit is that living bond Who unites. When we love selflessly, forgive generously, and build unity, we are not merely "being nice" — we are participating in God's own life.

And, we can allow the Trinity to shape our daily prayer. Pray to the Father with childlike trust: *Father, guide my steps today.* Turn to Jesus, the Son, our Brother and Lord: *Jesus, form my heart to love as You love.* Welcome the Holy Spirit: *Spirit of Truth, counsel and strengthen me.* As we address each divine Person, we grow in relationship with the one God who draws ever near to us.

Trinity Sunday is a good moment in time to renew our baptismal identity. We were baptized in the Name — not names — of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. That single Name proclaims God's unity; the threefold formula reveals His inner life. From that font flows our mission: to make disciples, to forgive as we have been forgiven, to be living signs of unity in a divided world.

Whenever we gather for the Eucharist here in our parish, the Trinity's love becomes visible. We offer the Mass to the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit. This week, come to the altar with thanksgiving. If you have been away from confession, consider returning; reconciliation is a powerful work of the Spirit Who heals and restores communion. And let us look for simple ways to reflect Trinitarian Love: a word of encouragement, a patient conversation, a meal shared, a bridge rebuilt.

As we honor the Trinity, we pray also for families, the "Domestic Church," called to mirror divine communion. Where there is strain, may the Spirit bring peace; where there is fatigue, may the Father's providence sustain; where there is hurt, may Christ's mercy bind up wounds.

May our parish be a home of unity, faith, and charity — a living doxology to the Triune God. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

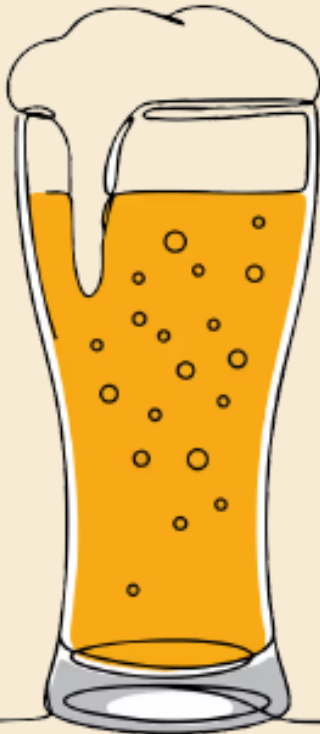

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy.

Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

June 7, 2026

John 6:51-58

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds:

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Reflection Questions

- How does John 6:51 deepen our understanding of Jesus as the "living bread"?
- What does "living bread" signify about Jesus' role in our spiritual nourishment? What actions demonstrate belief in Jesus as the "bread that came down"?
- What does "eat the flesh" and "drink His blood" symbolize in John 6:53?
- How can we apply the promise of resurrection in John 6:54 daily?
- How can we practically "abide in Me" as instructed in John 6:56?
- What does "lives because of Me" mean for believers' daily lives?
- How does understanding Jesus' relationship with the Father help us comprehend our relationship with Him?
- How does the concept of Jesus as the Bread of Life challenge our reliance on worldly sources of satisfaction?
- How can understanding the eternal nature of Christ's provision impact our perspective on current challenges and trials?

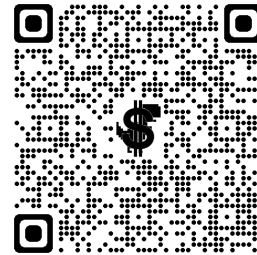

The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

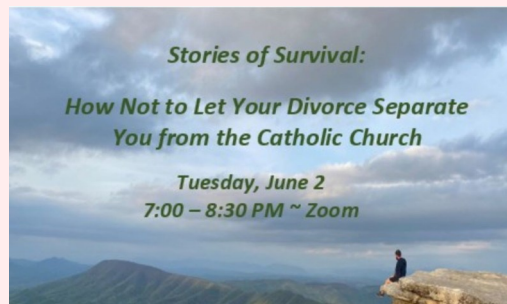

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

With the Solemnity of Pentecost last Sunday, the Easter Season came to an end. On Monday, we began Ordinary Time, that is, the period when priests wear the color green, a time during which we are called to live the Gospel in the ordinariness of everyday life, witnessing the joy of being disciples of the crucified and risen Jesus. If we were to pause and look back a moment, we would be able to visualize a unique image. From a balcony in the heavens, God the Father, aware of how humanity after Adam and Eve's sin (see Gn. 3) had gone astray and was unable of finding the way back to heaven, sent the prophets to help them find that way. But humanity not only failed to heed them, they also killed them

(see Mt. 23:29ff.).

In the end, moved with compassion, the Father sent His only Son: "And the Word was made flesh and made his dwelling among us" (Jn. 1:14). Jesus, the Son of God, shared everything about our human condition with us except sin, helping us to remember that we are created by God, that we are His children, and that God is our Father. Through His words and His life, He taught us with Truth regarding the Way to return to the Father, who is eternal Life. Thus, Jesus showed us the Father's face: "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (Jn. 14:9). He reminded us that the way to heaven is open to everyone, that there is no need to be afraid, and that we do not need to be ashamed because God the Father is love, He is faithfulness, He is mercy. Obedient to the Father, Jesus died on the cross for our salvation. On the third day He rose, defeating sin and death, thus opening the way to return to His Father and our Father

(this is what we celebrated on Easter Sunday).

We can confidently choose this Way because Jesus, having ascended into heaven, gave us the Holy Spirit on Pentecost (the Solemnity celebrated last Sunday), the first gift given to believers – the Person of Love poured out into our beings so we might live as children of God. This is how we can understand why the liturgy invites us to celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This Solemnity is a sort of synthesis and, above all, directs us toward the goal of our journey.

This God, who presents Himself as One and Triune, is not all that distant as it seems, but is so very close that He becomes Bread broken for us, Corpus Christi (which will be celebrated next Sunday). This Bread, the Bread of angels, nourishes us on our journey toward heaven. This gift then reveals the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, celebrated the Friday following Corpus Christi.

These three liturgical feasts are a synthesis of the mystery of our faith which we have lived in these last months: from Christmas to the death and resurrection of Jesus, from His Ascension to Pentecost. The Arian heresy, which disputed Jesus's divinity and His bond with the Holy Trinity, was condemned by the Council of Nicea in 325 and Constantinople in 381. These two Councils were providential in spreading the doctrine regarding the Trinity both through preaching and through devotion. As early as the 8th century, liturgical prefaces appeared containing references to the doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity. A votive Mass emerged toward the year 800 in honor of the Trinity, which could be celebrated on any Sunday. This decision was opposed because the Trinity is honored every Sunday. In the end, it was Pope John XXII who established the feast throughout the universal Church in 1334.

Prayer

"Keep uncontaminated this upright faith that is in me and, until my last breath, grant me likewise this voice of my conscience, that I may be ever faithful to what I professed in my regeneration when I was baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." (Saint Hilary of Poitiers)



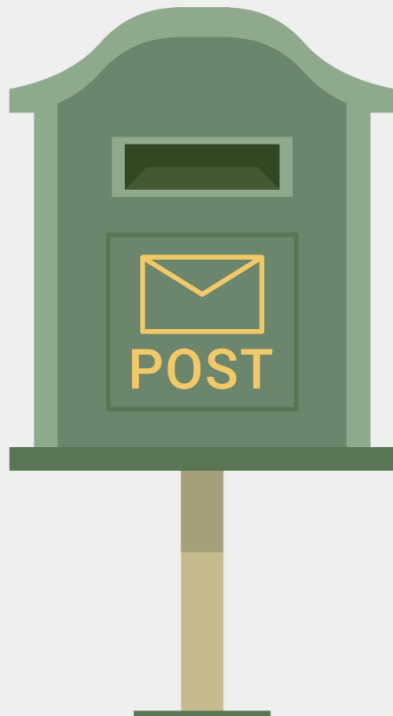

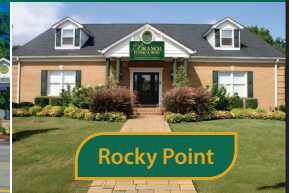

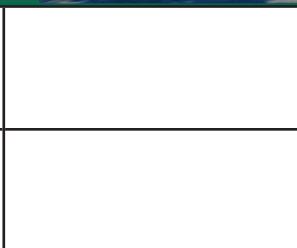
