A Message from our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we journey through the month of June, the Church invites us to reflect on two beautiful and interconnected mysteries of our faith: the Solemnity of Corpus Christi and devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Together, these feasts remind us of the immeasurable love God has for His people and the gift of His abiding presence among us.

On Corpus Christi, we rejoice in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. At every Mass, Christ offers Himself to us completely—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The Eucharist is not merely a symbol or a remembrance; it is the living presence of our Savior, Who nourishes us, strengthens us, and unites us as one Body in Him. Through this sacred gift, Jesus fulfills His promise: “I am with you always, until the end of the age” (Matthew 28:20). As we celebrate Corpus Christi, we are called not only to adore Christ in the Eucharist but also to become what we receive. Nourished by the Bread of Life, we are sent forth to be Christ’s presence in the world through acts of charity, mercy, forgiveness, and service to others.

June is also dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a devotion that directs our attention to the boundless love flowing from the Heart of our Redeemer. The Sacred Heart symbolizes Christ’s compassion, mercy, and self-giving love for all humanity. In a world often marked by uncertainty, anxiety and division, the Heart of Jesus stands as a refuge of hope and peace.

The Eucharist and the Sacred Heart are deeply connected. In the Blessed Sacrament, we encounter the same Heart that was pierced on Calvary and continues to pour out grace upon the Church. Every time we come before the Blessed Sacrament in prayer, or receive Holy Communion, we draw near to the Heart of Jesus, Who desires to lead us closer to the Father.

During this month, I encourage each of you to spend time in Eucharistic adoration, to attend Mass faithfully, and to deepen your devotion to the Sacred Heart through prayer and acts of love. May we open our hearts more fully to Christ, allowing His love to transform us and guide our daily lives. Let us ask the Sacred Heart of Jesus to bless our parish, to strengthen our families, and to draw all people closer to Him in the Eucharistic.

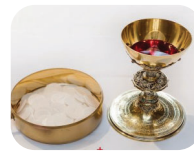

Breaking Open the Word

Reflecting on next Sunday's Gospel before you come to Mass can bring so much more meaning to your experience of the Liturgy.

Here's the Gospel for next Sunday. How does this Gospel touch your life?

June 14, 2026

The Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 9:36-10:8

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Reflection Questions

- How did Jesus respond when he saw the crowd of people? Why?
- What was Jesus' solution to the problem He saw before him?
- How can we prepare for the harvest? Are you ready for harvesting? What do we need to do to be a worker in God's harvest fields?
- What does the naming and sending of the twelve disciples signify in the ministry of Jesus?
- How do you understand the specific instructions Jesus gave to the disciples for their mission?
- Which elements of the apostle's mission was only for them in their specific context? Which elements are applicable to missions in every generation and in every context?
- What was to be their attitude when they were an ambassador for the Lord?
- How can Jesus' reassurance about God's care during persecution offer comfort in your personal challenges?

The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

- 1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
- 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

By looking toward the things above, which is consistent with the call to be "born from above" (see Jn. 3:3), Jesus reveals the perspective through which we are called to look on life – not stopping at earthly things, looking only horizontally (see Col. 3:1-4), but looking up, aiming high. The Eucharist is the Sacrament which catapults us toward the things of Heaven. It invites us to think higher, in a vertical dimension, according to God and not according to others (see Mk. 8:33). Toward that end, the Eucharist is offered to us as nourishment, strength, the bread from heaven so that "whoever eats my flesh will live because of me, will live forever" (see Jn. 6:51, 54). This, and only this, can deliver us from a flat and trivial life.

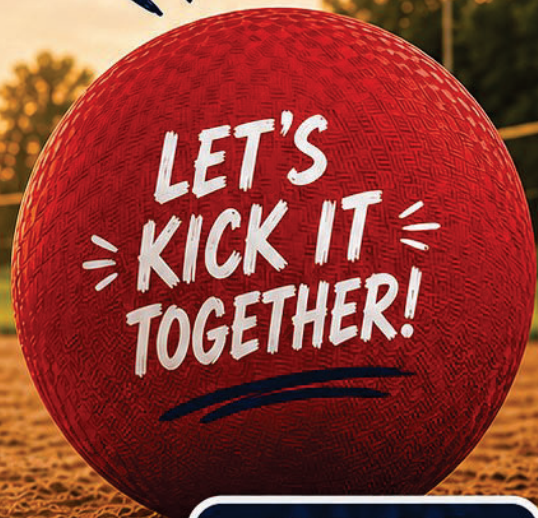

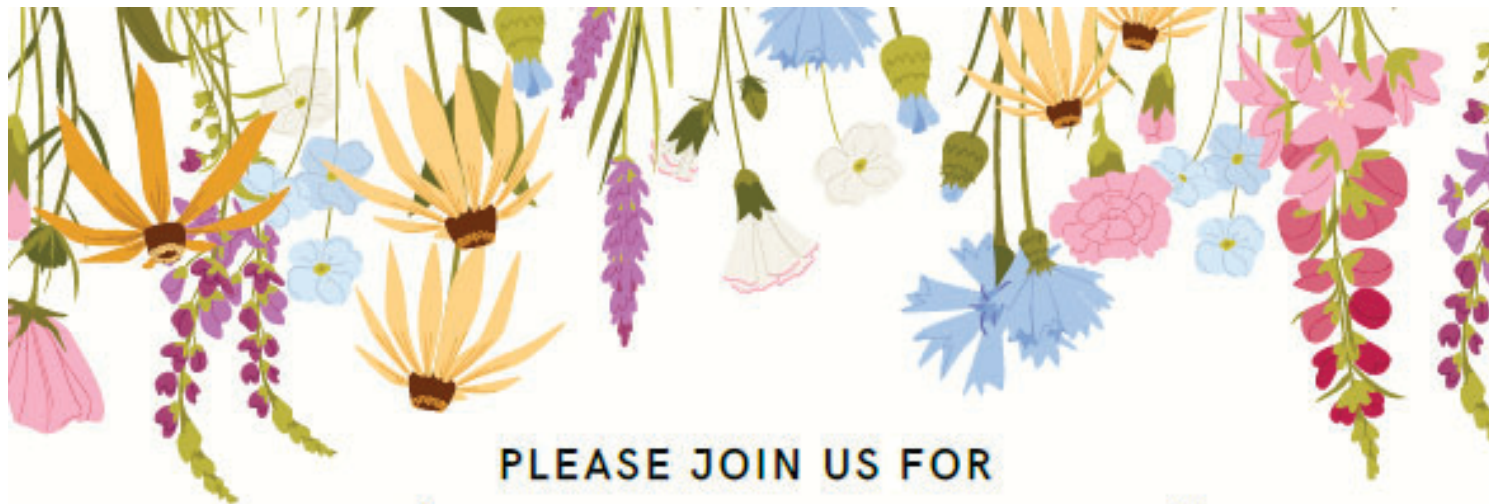

ALL ABOUT THE FEAST OF

Corpus Christi

What we celebrate

Corpus Christi is a feast day with the sole purpose of focusing on the Holy Eucharist.



When we celebrate

Officially the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. However, it's most often celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday.

Ways we celebrate

- A procession of the Eucharist around your parish.
- Eucharistic Adoration after Mass.
- Praying a traditional Catholic prayer called "Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament" at the end of Mass and singing songs about the Eucharist.
- If the Feast of Corpus Christi is a public holiday where you live, you may see a Eucharist procession (sometimes by candlelight) happening in the streets.

History

Saint Juliana of Liege (1193-1258), who had a great reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, began the cause for the feast day of Corpus Christi. This day would be apart from Holy Thursday when the Church focuses on not only the Eucharist but the washing of the feet, ordained priesthood, and Jesus in agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. Saint Juliana was motivated by a recurring vision of the Church as a full moon with one dark spot, which she interpreted as the absence of a specific reverence to the Holy Eucharist. In her later years, she gained the support of Jacques Pantaléon, at the time Archdeacon of Liège, and other Church leaders. Pantaléon was later elected Pope Urban IV and went on to establish the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Homework

Spend some time in prayer today asking for a greater ability to see the face of Christ in others. (If you're Catholic, spend that prayer time in front of the Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist). Then say a quick prayer for five random people that you pass throughout your day.

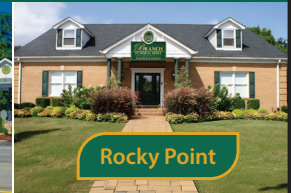

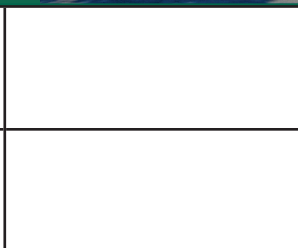

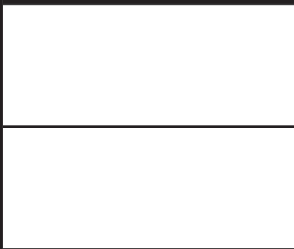
